A. APPROVAL OF PRICE QUOTE FOR INSTALLATION OF METAL LETTERS ON MURAL WALL

City Manager, David Dale, presented the price quote for the metal letters to be used on the mural wall at the intersection of 2nd Street and Cesar Chavez Boulevard. The letters will be 4 feet tall,

3 feet wide, and 4 inches thick. He mentioned that the letters will be installed on top of the 6 foot wall and the mural on the wall would painted. The road project is scheduled to be completed by June 21, 2019. The ribbon cutting for the wall mural installation is scheduled for June 25th.

Board member Durazo pointed out that the design that was selected at the last board meeting for the painted mural is the friendship bracelet. She mentioned that it could be drawn like a watermark as background for a "Welcome" phrase. Ms. Tauler will contact the artist to get the painting of the mural completed by June 25th.

Mr. Dale request a total amount not to exceed \$10,000 for the purchase of the letters and the installation, to be paid out of the Art in public places fund. On motion by Board member Carrillo, seconded by Chari Pacheco, and passed unanimously, the expenditure was approved.
