**SUBJECT:** Consider Adoption of Resolution Adopting Increases to Solid Waste Service Charges

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**Recommendation:**

It is recommended that the City Council of the City of Calexico:

1. Adopt Resolution No. 2026-\_\_\_ Adopting Increases to Solid Waste Service Charges

**Background:**

Allied Waste Transportation, Inc. d.b.a. Republic Services (Republic Services) exclusively provides solid waste collection services throughout the City pursuant to a solid waste franchise agreement. On October 2, 2019, the City Council of the City of Calexico approved a new agreement with Republic Services for the collection, transportation, recycling, composting and disposal of solid waste, recyclable and compostable materials. The effective date of that agreement was January 1, 2020.

**Discussion & Analysis:**

Per the agreement between the City and Republic Services, Republic Services is entitled to an annual CPI adjustment. Paragraph 4.08.1.1 allows for adjustments due to the CPI.

The rate increase was discussed at the City's Business Improvement District (BID) Meeting on January 8, 2026. Republic Waste presented the rate increase per the solid waste franchise agreement with Calexico. BID Members questions were addressed satisfactorily.

## **Historical Background**

In an abundance caution and without conceding the applicability of Proposition 218, the City provided notice and conducted a Prop. 218 majority protest hearing on April 2025 on proposed increases to the solid waste rates. While there was no majority protest against the rates, the City Council continued consideration of adopting the increased rates to a future meeting.

## **Proposed Action**

This item is presented to allow the City Council to adopt the previously noticed rates effective February 1, 2026. Republic Services is entitled to the rate adjustments under the franchise agreement with the City.

## **Fiscal Impact:**

There is no impact to the General Fund if the rates are approved.

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
CALEXICO, CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING INCREASES TO  
SOLID WASTE SERVICE CHARGES**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Calexico (the "City") provides solid waste services to residences, businesses, and other properties in the City through an exclusive solid waste franchise agreement (the "Franchise Agreement") with Allied Waste Transportation, Inc., d.b.a. Republic Services of Imperial County ("Republic Services"); and

**WHEREAS**, Republic Services provides the collection and handling of garbage, recycling, and organic waste services within the City (collectively, "Solid Waste Service"); and

**WHEREAS**, the City's Solid Waste Service charges ("Rates") charged to Solid Waste Service customers are determined by the terms of the Franchise Agreement based upon Republic Services costs to provide the service and are passed through to each customer utilizing the Solid Waste Service. The Franchise Agreement provides for inflationary increases in the Rates due to the annual percentage increase, year over year, in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers: Water and Sewer and Trash Collection Services, U.S. City Average (CUSR0000SEHG), as determined by the United States Department of Labor, U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics ("CPI"), as may be amended from time to time; and

**WHEREAS**, Republic Services was entitled to a CPI rate adjustment on January 1, 2023 under the Franchise Agreement, but the adjustment has been delayed, and the proposed Rate increases includes this CPI adjustment, with Rates taking effect February 1, 2026, described in attached Exhibit "A"; and

**WHEREAS**, the rate structure for Solid Waste Service is for three customer classes: (i) single family; (ii) multi-family; and (iii) commercial, and the Rates for Solid Waste Service for each customer class is determined based upon: (i) the size of the container serving the property; (ii) the materials accepted in the container (e.g., garbage, recyclables, or organic waste) serving the property; and (iii) the frequency of pickups per week; and

**WHEREAS**, revenues derived from the Rates will not exceed the funds required to provide the Solid Waste Service for which the Rates are imposed, and will be used solely for the purpose of defraying costs incurred in providing the Solid Waste Services and to ensure continued compliance with State law, including but not limited to, garbage, recycling, and organic waste pick-up, transportation, processing, disposal, facilities and equipment maintenance, capital projects and financing, and billing and accounting management; and

**WHEREAS**, article XIII D, section 6 of the California Constitution (“Article XIII D”) provides that prior to imposing any increase to certain property-related fees, the City shall provide written notice (the “Notice”) by mail of the new or increased fees to the record owner of each parcel upon which the fees are proposed for imposition and any tenant directly liable for payment of the fees, the amount of the fees proposed to be imposed on each parcel, the basis upon which the fees were calculated, the reason for the fees, and the date, time and location of a public hearing on the proposed fees; and

**WHEREAS**, in an abundance of caution and without conceding the applicability of Article XIII D to the Rates, the City provided written notice to the affected property owners and any tenant directly liable for the payment of the Rates not less than forty-five (45) days prior to a public hearing (“Hearing”) on the proposed Rates; and

**WHEREAS**, the Hearing was held on April 16, 2025; and

**WHEREAS**, at the Hearing the City Council heard and considered all oral testimony, written materials, and written protests concerning the establishment and imposition of the proposed increases for the Rates, and at the close of the Hearing the City did not receive written protests against the establishment and imposition of the proposed increases for the Rates from a majority of the affected property owners and tenants of the properties subject to the Rates; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has determined that it is necessary to impose increased Rates for its Solid Waste Service for customers and such Rates shall be effective February 1, 2026; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council now desires to establish and impose the proposed Rates for customers as set forth in Exhibit “A”; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Calexico as follows:

**SECTION 1. Recitals.** The City Council hereby finds that the foregoing recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein as substantive findings of this Resolution.

**SECTION 2. Adoption of Solid Waste Service Rates.** The City Council hereby adopts the Solid Waste Service Rates as set forth in Exhibit “A,” attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. The Rates set forth in Exhibit “A” shall be effective on February 1, 2026.

**SECTION 3. CEQA.** The City Council finds that the administration, operation, maintenance, and improvements of the City’s solid waste system, which are to be funded by the Rates, and set forth herein, are necessary to maintain service within the City’s existing solid waste service area as described herein. The City Council further finds that the administration, operation, maintenance and improvements of the City’s solid waste

system, to be funded by the Rates, will not expand the City's solid waste system. The City Council further finds that the adoption of the Rates is necessary and reasonable to fund the administration, operation, maintenance and improvements of the City's solid waste system. Based on these findings, the City Council determines that the adoption of the Rates established by this Resolution are exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act pursuant to section 21080(b)(8) of the Public Resources Code and section 15273(a) of the State CEQA Guidelines. The documents and materials that constitute the record of proceedings on which these findings have been based are located at City of Calexico, 608 Heber Avenue, Calexico, California 92231. The custodian for these records is the City Clerk of the City.

**SECTION 4. Severability.** If any provision of this Resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Resolution which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Resolution are severable. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted this Resolution irrespective of the invalidity of any particular portion thereof.

**SECTION 5. Conflicts.** All prior actions of the City Council, including resolutions, ordinances, or parts thereof, that are inconsistent with any provision of this Resolution are hereby superseded by this Resolution to the extent of such inconsistency.

**SECTION 6. Effective Date of Resolution.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

**SUBJECT:** Hold a Public Hearing and Consider Adoption of Resolution Adopting Increases to Solid Waste Service Charges.

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**Recommendation:**

It is recommended that the City Council of the City of Calexico:

1. Hold the Public Hearing on proposed Solid Waste Service Charges; and
2. If there is no majority protest, adopt Resolution No. 2025-\_\_\_ Adopting Increases to Solid Waste Service Charges

**Background:**

Allied Waste Transportation, Inc. d.b.a. Republic Services (Republic Services) exclusively provides solid waste collection services throughout the City pursuant to a solid waste franchise agreement. On October 2, 2019, the City Council of the City of Calexico approved a new agreement with Republic Services for the collection, transportation, recycling, composting and disposal of solid waste, recyclable and compostable materials. The effective date of that agreement was January 1, 2020.

**Discussion and Analysis:**

Per the agreement between the City and Republic Services, Republic Services is entitled to an annual CPI adjustment. Paragraph 4.08.1.1 allows for adjustments due to the CPI. The CPI adjustments take effect every January 1 (Attachment 1).

### *Residential Rates*

The City is conducting a Proposition 218 hearing to approve automatic CPI adjustments Republic Services is entitled to under the franchise agreement for five years. The City used existing revenues from the residential solid waste accounts to cover residential CPI adjustments to date. Therefore, there were no deferred CPI increases owed to Republic for residential solid waste services. The only increases to the residential rates will be for CPI adjustments.

### *Commercial Rates*

Republic Services has not increased commercial rates since 2022, pending a Proposition 218 hearing. However, Republic Services is entitled to the CPI increases it should have received in 2023, 2024, and through May 1, 2025 under the franchise agreement. The proposed commercial rates includes a "catch-up" fee that allows Republic Services to recover the deferred CPI increases. Instead of collecting the deferred amount all at once from commercial customers, commercial customers would pay the deferred amounts over the remaining six years of the contract term to lessen the impact to commercial customers. The proposed rates also include automatic CPI adjustments for commercial rates for five years.

### *Proposition 218 Procedures*

A notice was mailed to property owners and tenants receiving solid waste services regarding the public hearing and proposed solid waste rate increases pursuant to Proposition 218 at least 45 days before the hearing. The Proposition 218 notices in English and Spanish, with the proposed rates (Attachments 2 and 3) are included. A handout, "2025 Solid Waste Rate Change," details how much the rates will increase by for customers effective May 1, 2025 (Attachment 4).

If a majority of the owners/tenants of the parcels receiving solid waste services do not submit a written protest before the public hearing closes, then the City Council can approve Resolution (Attachment 5) approving the rate increases, which would take effect beginning May 1, 2025.

The City is conducting this Proposition 218 majority protest proceeding out of an abundance of caution and without conceding the applicability of Proposition 218 to Solid Waste Service.

### *Funding CPI Adjustments*

Republic Services is entitled to the rate adjustments under the franchise agreement with the City. If the City Council does not approve the rates, it will have to pay Republic Services the deferred amounts and future CPI increases for solid waste collection services provided using General Fund money.

### **Fiscal Impact:**

There is no impact to the General Fund if the rates are approved.

Rate adjustments are passed through to utility customers. Residential accounts are billed in advance by the City for the following month, fees are collected by the City, and remitted to Republic Services on a monthly basis.

Commercial customers are billed directly by Republic Services, pricing varies by size of bin and collection intervals, but are also subject to the CPI increase.

4.05 Delinquent Service Accounts Billed by CONTRACTOR. CONTRACTOR may, by September 1<sup>st</sup> of each year or at such other time as CITY and CONTRACTOR shall agree upon, notify CITY in writing as to whether CONTRACTOR will seek to have CITY place and collect qualifying delinquencies for MDF and Commercial Service Recipients on the tax roll. In such event, CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for timely preparing, at no cost to CITY, all required information, reports, notices, and materials including without limitation, the report required by Health & Safety Code section 5473, the notices required by Health & Safety Code section 5473.1, and paying for any publication costs. In addition, should CITY's City Attorney or special counsel, determine that placement of eligible delinquencies on the tax roll also required CITY to comply with the requirements of Proposition 218 and implementing legislation and court decisions (hereinafter "PROP 218), then CONTRACTOR shall timely prepare, at no cost to CITY, all required information, report, notices and materials necessary to comply with PROP 218. CITY agrees that it shall within sixty (60) days after the Effective Date of this Agreement consider the adoption of the necessary ordinance authorizing collection of eligible delinquent Service Recipients on the tax roll, and to hold all hearings, timely publish all notices, and timely make all filings, required under the above sections, provided CONTRACTOR has timely provided the required information, reports, notices and materials to CITY. For the purposes of this section, a "qualifying delinquency" is a Service Recipient that is at least sixty (60) days in arrears and for which the billing party has provided at least one written notice delivered to the Service Recipient by mail or other reasonable means.

4.05.1 CONTRACTOR's Reservation of Legal Rights and Remedies. Notwithstanding the foregoing, CONTRACTOR reserves its right to, and may take such action as is legally available to collect or cause collection of such past due amounts. CONTRACTOR must not discontinue Collection Services on any SFD Service Unit. CONTRACTOR may cease provision of Collection Services to any MFD Service Unit or Commercial Service Unit due to non-payment, including late fees and interest in the amounts set forth in Exhibit 1, upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the Service Recipient.

4.06 Billing List Review. The CITY, at CONTRACTOR's request (made no more often than every six months) will meet and confer with the CONTRACTOR to compare CONTRACTOR'S customer list and the service levels for each customer billed by the CITY, to ensure the accuracy of the CITY's billings.

4.08 Adjustments to Maximum Service Rates using the Consumer Price Index (CPI).

4.08.1 Adjustments to SFD, MFD, and Commercial Maximum Service Rates January 1, 2021 – December 31, 2029.

4.08.1.1 Adjustments Using the Consumer Price Index (CPI). Beginning on January 1, 2021 for SFD, MFD and Commercial Service Units, and annually thereafter, CONTRACTOR shall, subject to compliance with all provisions of this Section, receive an annual CPI adjustment to all Maximum Service Rates set forth in Exhibit 1 to this Agreement based on the year-over-year percentage increase in the CPI. The maximum CPI increase in any one year shall not exceed four percent (4.0%) over the prior reporting period as indicated by the CPI and the minimum increase shall not be less than one percent (1.0%) over the prior reporting period as indicated by the CPI. In any year in which the CPI indicates an increase of more than four percent (4%) ("overage") over the last reporting period, the amount of overage

due to the CPI will not be included in the CPI adjustment for the subject year; however, the amount of overage shall be carried over into and added to the next succeeding year CPI calculation to increase CONTRACTOR'S rates up to the 4.0% overall cap on CPI adjustments. Any unused overage from a given year shall only be used one time, for the next succeeding year only. The foregoing four percent (4.0%) cap shall not apply to other factors justifying a rate increase, such as a Change in Law, or a CITY requested Change in Scope of CONTRACTOR'S services or factors warranting an Extraordinary Rate Adjustment.

4.08.1.2 The annual CPI index increase shall be calculated using increases in the CPI pursuant to the process described below:

- A. CPI Financial Information. On or before October 1, 2020, and annually thereafter on October 1<sup>st</sup> during the Term of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall deliver to CITY financial information and all calculations sufficient to allow the CITY to verify the accuracy of CONTRACTOR's CPI adjustment.
- B. Rounding. Adjustments to the overall Maximum Service Rates shall be made only in units of one cent (\$0.01). Fractions of less than one cent (\$0.01) shall not be considered in making CPI adjustments. All CPI increases shall be rounded at two (2) decimal places for the adjustment calculations.

4.09 CITY Verify Calculation of Maximum Service Rates. On or before October 1, 2020, and annually thereafter during the term of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall notify CITY's Agreement Administrator in writing of the CPI adjustments to the affected Maximum Service rates to take place on the subsequent January 1<sup>st</sup> and the calculations such adjustments are derived from. The Agreement Administrator shall verify the calculations and the adjustment and shall resolve discrepancies in the calculation or adjustment with CONTRACTOR. The Parties agree that verification of the calculation and adjustment by CITY's Agreement Administrator shall constitute an amendment of rate sheets as reflected in **Exhibit 1** of the Agreement. This process shall not apply to Extraordinary Adjustments as provided in Section 4.11. To assist the CITY in providing Proposition 218 notifications, CITY and CONTRACTOR shall confer on an appropriate 12-month period to use in determining any annual CPI adjustment subject to the Proposition 218 notification process.

4.10 Recyclable Materials Processing and Marketing Adjustment. From January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020 CONTRACTOR shall determine baseline values for collection, processing and return to market for recyclable materials collected from CITY for SFD, MFD and Commercial in the aggregate, will meet and confer with CITY with regard to these calculations and CITY and CONTRACTOR will mutually agree to the SFD, MFD and Commercial baseline values ("Baseline Values"). After January 1, 2020, if CONTRACTOR experiences a positive or negative change of more than 10% in the Baseline Values, CONTRACTOR may request to meet and confer with CITY to discuss possible adjustments to the Maximum Service Rates not covered under Section 4.08 above. CONTRACTOR must provide verifiable documentation to the CITY's satisfaction of the change in Baseline Values if the CITY is to consider any adjustments to the Maximum Service Rates not covered under Section 4.08. Any such adjustment under this Section 4.10 shall be considered as an Extraordinary Adjustment to Maximum Service Rates as provided for in Section 4.11.

**Notice of Public Hearing on Proposed Increase in**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Calexico City Council will hold a public hearing on or after 6:30 PM on April 16, 2025, or as soon as possible thereafter, in the City Council Chambers, 608 Heber Avenue, Calexico, CA 92231 to consider adopting increases to the rates for collection and handling of garbage, recycling, and organic waste services within the City (collectively, "Solid Waste Service"). Said public hearing will be held to consider all oral testimony and written protests to, and the adoption of the proposed rate increases. This notice is being provided to you 45 days in advance of the public hearing as a property owner of record and tenants subject to the proposed rates to be charged.

**Proposed Increase**

Allied Waste Transportation, Inc. dba Republic Services of Imperial County ("Republic Services") provides Solid Waste Service within the City pursuant to an exclusive franchise agreement. The rate structure for monthly Solid Waste Service is for three customer classes: (i) single family; (ii) multi-family; and (iii) commercial. The rates for Solid Waste Service for each customer class is determined based on: (i) the size of the container serving the property; (ii) the materials accepted in the container (e.g., garbage, recyclables, or organic waste) serving the property; and (iii) the frequency of pickups per week.

**Public Hearing Process**

All Calexico property owners of record and tenants are invited to attend this public hearing. The Calexico City Council will hear and consider all materials and testimony as well as all written protests against the proposed rate increases. At the close of the public hearing, the City Council may adopt new rates if written protests against the proposed increases are not presented by a majority of identified parcels upon which the proposed rates are to be charged. If adopted, the rates shall take effect May 1, 2025. As noted in more detail below, the rates may also be adjusted for Annual Automatic Adjustments (as defined below) for a five-year period.

**Basis for Rate Increases**

The request for the proposed rate increases shown in Exhibit A is based upon the City's existing solid waste franchise agreement ("Franchise Agreement") with Republic Services. The Franchise Agreement provides for inflationary increases in Solid Waste Service rates due to the annual percentage increase, year over year, October through September, in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers: Water and Sewer and Trash Collection Services, U.S. City Average (CUSR0000SEHG), as determined by the United States Department of Labor, U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics ("CPI").

Commercial Rates

Republic Services was entitled to a CPI rate adjustment on January 1, 2023, January 1, 2024 and January 1, 2025 under the Franchise Agreement. Republic has deferred collection of these adjustments until April 1, 2025. The proposed rate increases for Solid Waste Service includes these delayed adjustments, with the rates taking effect May 1, 2025. For the two years between January 1, 2023 and May 1, 2025 that the CPI adjustment was delayed, Republic Services will spread the collection of the amounts it was entitled to over the remainder of the term (almost six years) to reduce the impact to customers. The collection of the delayed CPI adjustment is reflected in the rates in Exhibit A.

If the rates for Solid Waste Service are approved by the City Council, Republic Services will implement the Solid Waste Service rate increases in Exhibit A effective May 1, 2025.

Revenues derived from the Solid Waste Service rates are used solely for the purpose of defraying costs incurred in providing efficient Solid Waste Service and to ensure continued compliance with State law, including but not limited to, garbage, recycling and organic waste pick-up, transportation, processing, disposal, facilities and equipment maintenance, capital projects and financing, and billing and account management.

**Future Automatic Rate Increases**

Because the City anticipates future increases in the cost of providing Solid Waste Service that Republic Services will charge pursuant to the Franchise Agreement, the City is also proposing to annually pass through to all Solid Waste Service customers any automatic CPI adjustments for inflation ("Annual Automatic Adjustments"). These adjustments will impact the Solid Waste Service rates. If approved, beginning January 1, 2026, and each January 1 thereafter for a five-year period, through and including adjustments effective on or after January 1, 2030, the rates for Solid Waste Services in Exhibit A may be adjusted annually, without a further public hearing, by an amount not to exceed the annual percentage increase, if any, in the CPI, subject to a maximum increase of 4% annually. In no event may an automatic increase exceed the City's cost of providing Solid Waste Services.

**To protest the proposed rate increases, you must submit a written protest**

Any record owner or tenant of a parcel upon which the Solid Waste Service rates are proposed may submit a written protest to the proposed rate increases and pass-through adjustments. To oppose the proposed rate increases and/or adjustments, you must submit a written protest, even if you plan to attend the public hearing. Your written protest must be actually received (not postmarked) by the Calexico City Clerk prior to the close of the public hearing. **Oral, telephonic and e-mail protests will not be accepted.** You must sign the protest and include: 1) the name and signature of the property owner/tenant 2) the street address of the property receiving service 3) your Solid Waste Service account number, and 4) a clear written statement protesting the rate increase. Please identify on the front of the envelope that the enclosed letter is for the "2025 Solid Waste Rate Increase Public Hearing." You may mail or deliver your written protest in person to: City of Calexico, Office of the City Clerk, 608 Heber Avenue, Calexico, CA 92231. Only one written protest will be counted per identified parcel. The City is conducting this Proposition 218 majority protest proceeding out of an abundance of caution and without conceding the applicability of Proposition 218 to Solid Waste Service.

**Aviso de audiencia pública sobre el aumento propuesto de**  
**Tarifas del Servicio de Residuos Sólidos**

**POR LA PRESENTE SE NOTIFICA** que el Concejo Municipal de Calexico llevará a cabo una audiencia pública el 16 de abril de 2025 a partir de las 6:30 p. m., o lo antes posible después de esa fecha, en la sala de cabildo ubicada en 608 Heber Avenue, Calexico, CA 92231. Durante la reunión se considerará la adopción de aumentos de las tarifas de recolección y manejo de basura, reciclaje y servicios de desechos orgánicos dentro de la Ciudad (denominados colectivamente “Servicio de Residuos Sólidos”). Durante dicha audiencia pública se considerarán todos los testimonios orales y las protestas escritas, así como la adopción de los aumentos de tarifas propuestos. Este aviso se le está proporcionando a usted 45 días antes de la audiencia pública como dueño de propiedad registrado e inquilinos sujetos a las tarifas propuestas que se cobrarán.

**Aumento propuesto**

Allied Waste Transportation, Inc., haciendo negocios como Republic Services of Imperial County (“Republic Services”) proporciona el Servicio de Residuos Sólidos dentro de la Ciudad de conformidad con un contrato de franquicia exclusivo. La estructura de tarifas para el Servicio de Residuos Sólidos mensual es para tres tipos de clientes: (i) unifamiliares, (ii) multifamiliares, y (iii) comerciales. Las tarifas que se pagan por el servicio de residuos sólidos para cada tipo de cliente se fijan en función de: (i) el tamaño del contenedor que da servicio a la propiedad; (ii) los materiales aceptados en el contenedor (por ejemplo, basura, materiales reciclables o desechos orgánicos) que da servicio a la propiedad; y (iii) la frecuencia de las recolecciones por semana.

**Proceso de audiencia pública**

Se invita a todos los dueños de propiedades registrados e inquilinos en Calexico a asistir a esta audiencia pública. El Concejo Municipal de Calexico escuchará y evaluará todos los materiales y testimonios, así como todas las protestas por escrito contra los aumentos de tarifas propuestos. Al cierre de la audiencia pública, el concejo municipal podrá adoptar las nuevas tarifas si las protestas por escrito en contra de los aumentos propuestos no son presentadas por la mayoría de las parcelas identificadas sobre las que se cobrarán las tarifas propuestas. Si se adoptan, las tarifas entrarán en vigor el 1 de mayo de 2025. Como se indica con más detalle a continuación, las tarifas también pueden ajustarse mediante Ajustes Automáticos Anuales (como se define a continuación) durante un período de cinco años.

**Base para los aumentos de tarifas**

La solicitud de los aumentos de tarifas propuestos que se muestran en el Anexo A se basa en el contrato de franquicia de residuos sólidos existente de la ciudad (“Contrato de Franquicia”) con Republic Services. El contrato de franquicia prevé aumentos inflacionarios en las tarifas del servicio de residuos sólidos debido al aumento porcentual anual, año tras año de octubre a septiembre, en el Índice de Precios al Consumidor para todos los consumidores urbanos: servicios de agua, alcantarillado y recolección de basura, promedio de las ciudades de los Estados Unidos (CUSR0000SEHG), tal como lo determina el Departamento de Trabajo de los Estados Unidos, Oficina de Estadísticas Laborales de los Estados Unidos (CPI, por sus siglas en inglés).

**Tarifas comerciales**

Republic Services tenía derecho a un ajuste de tarifas por el CPI el 1 de enero de 2023, el 1 de enero de 2024 y el 1 de enero de 2025 bajo el contrato de la franquicia. Republic ha postergado el cobro de estos ajustes hasta el 1 de abril de 2025. Los aumentos de tarifas propuestos para el Servicio de Residuos Sólidos incluyen estos ajustes aplazados junto con las tarifas que entrarán en vigor el 1 de mayo de 2025. Durante los dos años entre el 1 de enero de 2023 y el 1 de mayo de 2025 en que se retrasó el ajuste del CPI, Republic Services extenderá la recaudación de los montos a los que tenía derecho durante el resto del plazo (casi seis años) para reducir el impacto a los clientes. La recaudación del ajuste del CPI retrasado se refleja en las tarifas del Anexo A.

Si el concejo municipal aprueba las tarifas del Servicio de Residuos Sólidos, Republic Services aplicará, a partir del 1 de mayo de 2025, los aumentos a las tarifas del Servicio de Residuos Sólidos descritas en el Anexo A.

Los ingresos derivados de las tarifas del Servicio de Residuos Sólidos se utilizan únicamente para sufragar los costos incurridos en la prestación de un Servicio de Residuos Sólidos eficiente, y para garantizar el cumplimiento continuo de la ley estatal, incluido, pero no limitado a la recolección de basura, reciclaje y residuos orgánicos, transporte, procesamiento, eliminación, mantenimiento de instalaciones y equipos, proyectos de capital y financiamiento, y facturación y gestión de cuentas.

#### **Aumentos de tarifas automáticas futuros**

Debido a que la Ciudad prevé aumentos en el futuro en el costo de la prestación del Servicio de Residuos Sólidos que Republic Services cobrará de conformidad con el Acuerdo de Franquicia, la Ciudad también propone transferir anualmente a todos los clientes del Servicio de Residuos Sólidos cualquier ajuste automático del CPI por inflación ("Ajustes Automáticos Anuales"). Estos ajustes afectarán las tarifas del Servicio de Residuos Sólidos. Si se aprueban, a partir del 1 de enero de 2026, y cada 1 de enero a partir de ese momento durante un período de cinco años, incluso los ajustes que entren en vigencia a partir del 1 de enero de 2030, las tarifas de los Servicios de Residuos Sólidos en el Anexo A podrán ajustarse anualmente sin necesidad de una audiencia pública adicional y por un monto que no exceda el aumento porcentual anual, si existiera, en el CPI, sujeto a un aumento máximo del 4 % anual. En ningún caso un aumento automático puede exceder el costo de la Ciudad de proporcionar los Servicios de Residuos Sólidos.

#### **Para protestar contra los aumentos de tarifas propuestos debe presentar una protesta por escrito**

Cualquier propietario registrado o inquilino de una parcela sobre la cual se proponen las tarifas del Servicio de Residuos Sólidos puede presentar una protesta por escrito contra los aumentos de tarifas propuestos y los ajustes que se transfieren. Para oponerse a los aumentos de tarifas y ajustes que se transfieren, usted debe presentar una protesta por escrito, incluso si planea asistir a la audiencia pública. Su protesta por escrito debe ser recibida (sin matasellos) por el secretario de la Ciudad de Calexico antes del cierre de la audiencia pública. No se aceptarán protestas orales, por teléfono o correo electrónico. Usted debe firmar la protesta e incluir: 1) el nombre y la firma del propietario de la propiedad o del inquilino 2) la dirección de la propiedad que recibe el servicio 3) su número de cuenta del Servicio de Residuos Sólidos y 4) una declaración clara por escrito protestando contra el aumento de tarifas. Por favor indique en el frente del sobre que la carta adjunta es para la "Audiencia Pública sobre el Aumento de Tarifas de Residuos Sólidos 2025". Puede enviar su protesta por correo o entregarla personalmente a: City of Calexico, Office of the City Clerk, 608 Heber Avenue, Calexico, CA 92231. Solo se contabilizará una protesta por escrito por cada parcela identificada.

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
CALEXICO, CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING INCREASES TO  
SOLID WASTE SERVICE CHARGES**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Calexico (the "City") provides solid waste services to residences, businesses, and other properties in the City through an exclusive solid waste franchise agreement (the "Franchise Agreement") with Allied Waste Transportation, Inc., d.b.a. Republic Services of Imperial County ("Republic Services"); and

**WHEREAS**, Republic Services provides the collection and handling of garbage, recycling, and organic waste services within the City (collectively, "Solid Waste Service"); and

**WHEREAS**, the City's Solid Waste Service charges ("Rates") charged to Solid Waste Service customers are determined by the terms of the Franchise Agreement based upon Republic Services costs to provide the service and are passed through to each customer utilizing the Solid Waste Service. The Franchise Agreement provides for inflationary increases in the Rates due to the annual percentage increase, year over year, in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers: Water and Sewer and Trash Collection Services, U.S. City Average (CUSR0000SEHG), as determined by the United States Department of Labor, U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics ("CPI"), as may be amended from time to time; and

**WHEREAS**, Republic Services was entitled to a CPI rate adjustment on January 1, 2023 under the Franchise Agreement, but the adjustment has been delayed, and the proposed Rate increases for commercial Solid Waste Service includes this CPI adjustment, with Rates taking effect May 1, 2025, described in attached Exhibit "A"; and

**WHEREAS**, the rate structure for Solid Waste Service is for three customer classes: (i) single family; (ii) multi-family; and (iii) commercial, and the Rates for Solid Waste Service for each customer class is determined based upon: (i) the size of the container serving the property; (ii) the materials accepted in the container (e.g., garbage, recyclables, or organic waste) serving the property; and (iii) the frequency of pickups per week; and

**WHEREAS**, revenues derived from the Rates will not exceed the funds required to provide the Solid Waste Service for which the Rates are imposed, and will be used solely for the purpose of defraying costs incurred in providing the Solid Waste Services and to ensure continued compliance with State law, including but not limited to, garbage, recycling, and organic waste pick-up, transportation, processing, disposal, facilities and equipment maintenance, capital projects and financing, and billing and accounting management; and

**WHEREAS**, article XIII D, section 6 of the California Constitution ("Article XIII D") requires that prior to imposing any increase to the Rates, the City shall provide written notice (the "Notice") by mail of the new or increased Rates to the record owner of each parcel upon which the Rates are proposed for imposition and any tenant directly liable for payment of the Rates, the amount of the Rates proposed to be imposed on each parcel, the basis upon which the Rates were calculated, the reason for the Rates, and the date, time and location of a public hearing (the "Hearing") on the proposed Rates; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Article XIII D such Notice is required to be provided to the affected property owners and any tenant directly liable for the payment of the Rates not less than forty-five (45) days prior to the Hearing on the proposed Rates, and the City provided such notice in compliance with Article XIII D; and

**WHEREAS**, the Hearing was held on this day, April 16, 2025; and

**WHEREAS**, at the Hearing the City Council heard and considered all oral testimony, written materials, and written protests concerning the establishment and imposition of the proposed increases for the Rates, and at the close of the Hearing the City did not receive written protests against the establishment and imposition of the proposed increases for the Rates from a majority of the affected property owners and tenants of the properties subject to the Rates; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has determined that it is necessary to impose increased Rates for its Solid Waste Service and such Rates shall be effective May 1, 2025; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council now desires to establish and impose the proposed Rates as set forth in Exhibit "A"; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has further determined that due to anticipated future cost increases in providing the Solid Waste Service, the City shall authorize an annual pass-through to Solid Waste Service customers an automatic CPI adjustment for inflation (the "Annual Automatic Adjustments") effective January 1, 2026, and each January 1 thereafter for a five (5) year period, through and including January 1, 2030 without further public hearings, by an amount not to exceed the annual percentage increase, if any, in the CPI, not to exceed an annual increase of four percent (4%) annually; and

**WHEREAS**, in no event shall the Annual Automatic Adjustments exceed the City's cost of providing the Solid Waste Service.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Calexico as follows:

**SECTION 1. Recitals.** The City Council hereby finds that the foregoing recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein as substantive findings of this Resolution.

**SECTION 2. Adoption of Solid Waste Service Rates.** The City Council hereby adopts the Solid Waste Service Rates, to be effective on the dates, in the amounts, and at the rates set for in Exhibit "A," attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

**SECTION 3. Authorization for Annual Automatic Adjustments.** The City Council hereby adopts the Annual Automatic Adjustments effective January 1, 2026, and each January 1 thereafter for a five (5) year period, through and including January 1, 2030 without further public hearings. Pursuant to such authority, the City shall be authorized annually to increase the Solid Waste Service Rates to account for any Rate increase as a result of the percentage increase, year over year, in the CPI, if any, provided the City shall not increase the Rates by more than four percent (4%) in any calendar year, and in no event shall any such Annual Automatic Adjustment cause the Rates to exceed the cost of providing the Solid Waste Service. Prior to implementing any increase in the Rates as a result of the Annual Automatic Adjustment, the City shall provide written notice of the Rate increase at least thirty (30) days in advance of the effective date.

**SECTION 4. CEQA.** The City Council finds that the administration, operation, maintenance, and improvements of the City's solid waste system, which are to be funded by the Rates, and set forth herein, are necessary to maintain service within the City's existing solid waste service area as described herein. The City Council further finds that the administration, operation, maintenance and improvements of the City's solid waste system, to be funded by the Rates, will not expand the City's solid waste system. The City Council further finds that the adoption of the Rates is necessary and reasonable to fund the administration, operation, maintenance and improvements of the City's solid waste system. Based on these findings, the City Council determines that the adoption of the Rates established by this Resolution are exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act pursuant to section 21080(b)(8) of the Public Resources Code and section 15273(a) of the State CEQA Guidelines. The documents and materials that constitute the record of proceedings on which these findings have been based are located at City of Calexico, 608 Heber Avenue, Calexico, California 92231. The custodian for these records is the City Clerk of the City.

**SECTION 5. Severability.** If any provision of this Resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Resolution which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Resolution are severable. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted this Resolution irrespective of the invalidity of any particular portion thereof.

**SECTION 6. Conflicts.** All prior actions of the City Council, including resolutions, ordinances, or parts thereof, that are inconsistent with any provision of this Resolution are hereby superseded by this Resolution to the extent of such inconsistency.

**SECTION 7. Effective Date of Resolution.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
