BASIC FUNCTION:

Under the direction of an assigned supervisor, perform a variety of duties in the preventive maintenance and repair of wastewater systems, facilities and related equipment including tasks in plumbing, electrical, mechanical and carpentry work.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES:

ESSENTIAL DUTIES:

Perform a variety of duties in the preventive maintenance and repair of wastewater systems, facilities and related equipment including tasks in plumbing, electrical, mechanical and carpentry work; evaluate maintenance, servicing and repair needs; assure safe and proper functioning of wastewater systems and equipment.

Inspect wastewater facility, lift station and mechanical pump equipment and systems such as motors, valves, pumps, tanks and gauges; diagnose and repair mechanical and electrical malfunctions; replace system components as needed; maintain and repair electrical outlets as needed.

Install, maintain, clean and repair water pumps, filters, valves and other plumbing components in wastewater facilities equipment; install, fit and replace pipes; inspect and repair leaks, obstructions and general system failures.

Repair or fabricate articles of wood or related materials for wastewater facilities, structures and fixtures; repair and maintain floors, walls, ceilings and roofs as assigned; apply paint or other protective or decorative material to a variety of surfaces as needed; prepare surfaces for painting.

Communicate with City personnel and outside agencies to exchange information and resolve issues or concerns.

Operate a variety of equipment including man lifts, backhoes, ladders, and hand and power tools; drive a vehicle to conduct work.

Perform welding in the fabrication, repair and installation of metal parts and components as assigned; utilize appropriate welding equipment.

Estimate and assure adequate labor, equipment and material levels to meet project needs; work from sketches, diagrams, schematics and manuals.
